

# LOCAL VOICES: 2021 PULSE SURVEY RESULTS AT A GLANCE

Thank you for your contribution to the Voconiq Local Voices 'pulse' survey for Port Waratah across the Newcastle area. We had amazing participation in this survey and present a summary of the results. Responses were collected in March 2021, with this 'pulse' survey focusing on Port Waratah's diversity and inclusion performance as well as tracking key elements in the relationship they have with community members.

## Key takeaways:



**Trust and acceptance** remained steady and positive.



There was positive agreement that Port Waratah "lives the values of diversity and inclusion" and values its employees equally.



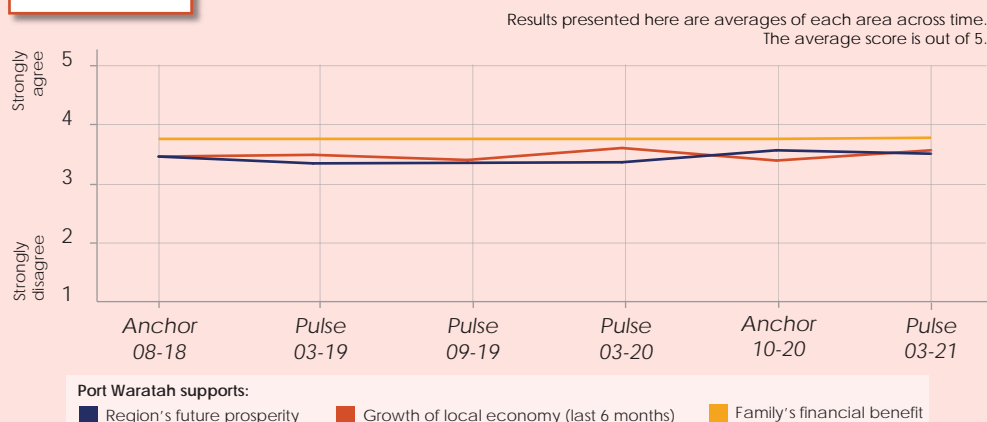
Community members **confidence in the regulation of Port Waratah** increased slightly from 3.25 in the 'anchor' survey to 3.34 in the last 'pulse' survey - a key driver of **community trust** in the company.



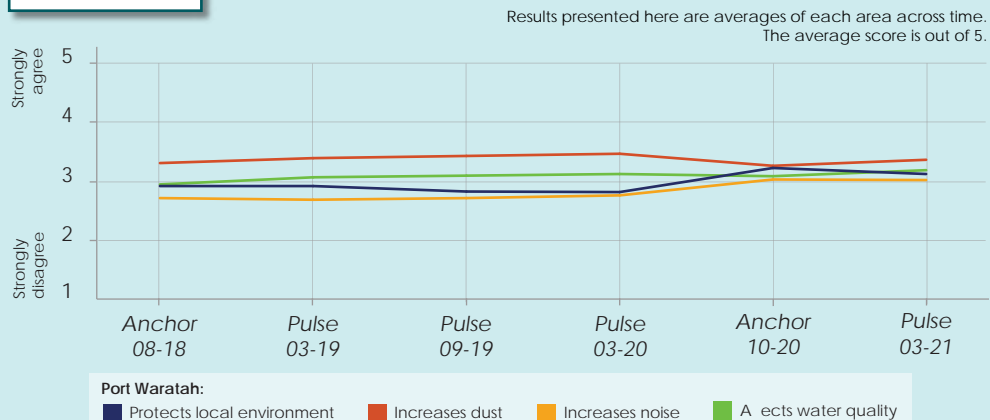
42% of the respondents agreed or strongly agreed that Port Waratah "lives the values of diversity and inclusion" with positive agreement that **the company values its employees equally**.

Results from this 'pulse' survey show that ratings of environmental impacts remained steady, or slightly increased (e.g. for dust impacts). We also saw similar small drops in community confidence regarding management of these issues by Port Waratah. The economic contribution of Port Waratah to the local economy through employment, contribution to local economic growth and the region's future prosperity remains strong and positive.
